II. Reading Task

This reading passage gives useful and clear information about Bangkok International Airport. The statistical data are taken from <u>The 1998 Annual Report of the Airports Authority of Thailand</u>. Read the text carefully and answer the questions that follow.

Bangkok International Airport, located at Don Muang, north of Bangkok, is the largest in Thailand. It contains fifty-two aircraft parking stands, twenty-six of which are aerobridges connecting the aircraft with the terminal. The main passenger terminal is designed to accommodate sixteen million passengers per year, and the cargo terminals are designed to handle 400,000 metric tons. The main building has four storeys. The ground floor accommodates about nine hundred vehicles. The first floor and the second floor are for the disembarking passengers who pass through some of the sixty-six immigration booths, pick up baggage from one of the eight baggage carousels, then are inspected at one of the twenty-two customs check-points. After passing through all these formalities, one will find banks, a post office, tourist agencies, hotel agencies, limousines and airport taxis, and joint airport security offices, along with a lot of well-wishers before getting out of the airport for downtown Bangkok. The third floor is for the sixteen check-in counters for embarking passengers and forty immigration booths, while the fourth floor is a location where one can view the parked aircraft, or sit at leisure and dine comfortably.


