1. The North Korean People's Army has agreed to meet US 8th army to discuss the fate of a helicopter downed in North Korea. This comes as the U.S. command has grounded all helicopters near the de-militarized zone. The meeting, the second since the helicopter was downed in North Korea is scheduled to be held in the truce village of Pamumjan some time today.

Russian troops are pressing ahead with their fierce attack on the Chechan Capital Grozny. The Russian forces following air raids and artillery barrages last night have moved to completely encircle the beseiged city. The air and ground attacks have left scenes of devastation in Grozny which is mostly deserted as many of the 350,000 residents have already fled.

Two passenger trains collided in spectacular crash in Sydney, Australia this morning and miraculously no one was injured. The two trains which were empty except for crew members collided at

a station in a northern suburb, derailling carriages and partially destroying the railway station. If the accident had happened shortly thereafter, both trains would have been filled with passengers.

The Indian Parliament was gripped by Bedlam today as the Opposition pressed its attack on the government of Prime Minister Narasimha Rao over a series of corruption scandals. After Prime Minister came to the defense of his food minister over a sugar import scandal, pandemonium broke out in Parliament. The government's decision not to release a report on a billion dollar security scan added to the chaos.

The Phillipines has voiced its concern about a Japanese freighter which is due to sail from France to Japan next February with a cargo of radioactive nuclear waste. The Foreign Ministry also announced that it's banning the ship from Phillipines waters. A new shipment of 14 tons of radioactive waste is due to return to Japan after re-processing in France.

And in Hollywood the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences has finally revealed that most movie fans have known

for some time. They have no class. The Academy, which has seen more than its fair share of snobbish behavior has refused to make comedian Rodney Dangerfield a member. The star of such memorable film classics as "Caddy Shaggle" and "Back to School" has been deemed unworthy to join the organization that counts as its members Pia Zidora, Madonna and Pee-wee Herman.

2. The Italian government is not expected to survive the week after the Northern League, a partner in the ruling coalition decided to throw its lot in with the Opposition. Umberto Bossi, 53, leader of the party, now joined forces with the former communists and the Christian democrats, two political forces he had long ridiculed. Prime Minister Silvio Berlusconi, who was expected to resign this week has labelled Mr. Bossi as a Judas.

The airlift into Sarajevo has resumed after a month's closure with 30 UN military and humanitarian flights expected today. The airport was opened to UNPROFOR flights alone on Saturday and the UN high commission for refugees began its flights yesterday. Sarajevo normally receives around 80% of its supplies by air.

Some 10,000 Israelites are on a secret list banning them from getting married because the Minister of Religious Affairs has classed them as bastards or impure. Israeli radio has reported that those on the list remain unaware until they are refused permission to marry by Orthodox Rabbinacle Courts. Almost 3,000 people have been classed as confirmed bastards. Under the Jewish religion a child resulted from a married woman's affair is considered a bastard and so are all their children for the next ten generations.

Japan says it's ready to spend 250 million dollar next year on programs aimed at addressing atrocities committed against Asian neighbors to mark the 50th anniversary of the end of World War II. However Tokyo has repeated its stance that no compensation will be paid directly to individual war victims. The Japanese Prime Minister Tomi Ishimiriama announced in August that Japan will offer one million dollar over the next ten years to help atone for acts of aggression during the war.

And Beach Boys originals Brian Wilson, Mike Love have made up after a row over millions of dollars in royalties that

Love claimed he was denied. Love who still performs with a revamped Beach Boys successfully filed a five million dollar lawsuit for royalties from such hits as "California Girls", "Wouldn't It Be Nice?" and "I Get around". Now that the two have made up there is talk Wilson rejoining the Beach Boys.

Minister Thaksin says his Ministry has reported to the Prime Minister on the issue pointing out that Thailand had two options to authorize Thai authorities to consider his case on the Thai law or to leave the decision to the Prime Minister as the head of the government. However he said the Thai government would not grant political asylum to General Sin Song because Thailand would like to maintain good relations with Cambodia. General Sin Song will only be allowed to stay temporarily in Thailand.

Foreign Minister Thaksin Chinawat has Cambodian court paper showed convicted coup leader Sin Song can be classified as a political prisoner. Thaksin said it's now up to the Prime Minister or the court to decide whether the General can be allowed to seek asylum in the third country. Sin Song was arrested in Bangkok early last month in charge with illegal entry. So far no state

has agreed to accept him and Foreign Minister said Thailand will not allow him permanent shelter.

"It's not appropriate to allow him to stay here in Thailand since we have a very good relationship with Cambodian government."

The U.S. led United Nations command said the refusal came during a meeting of generals from both sides at the Pamumjun truce village on the border.

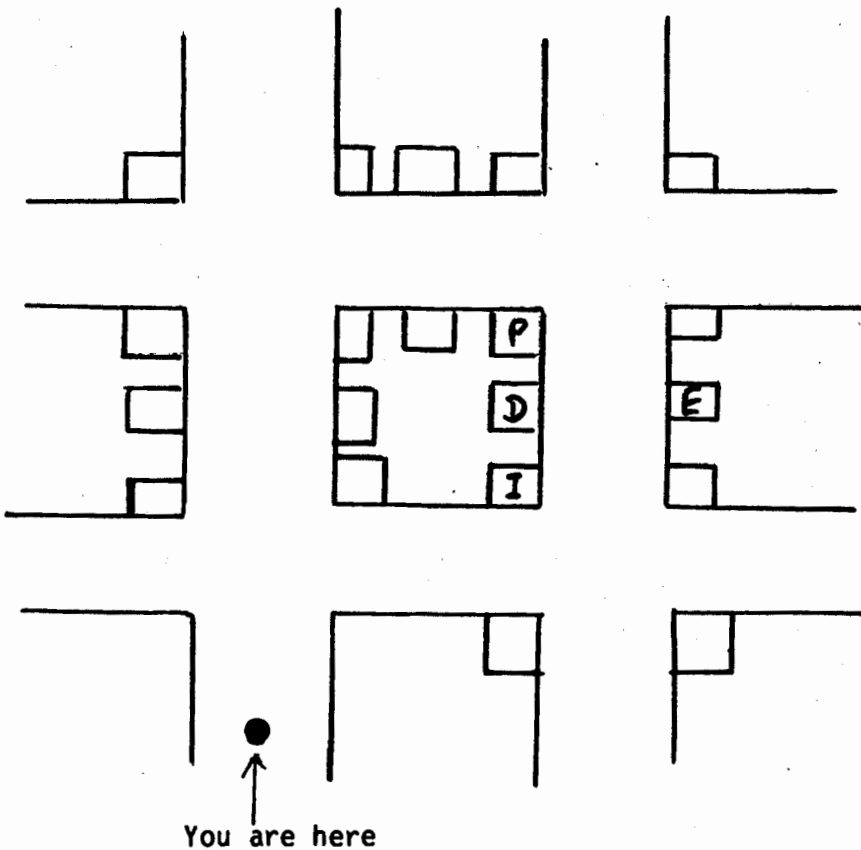

1. A Singapore Court charged four Australians on Friday with unlawful possession of firearms.

Arthur Affleck, 58, Damian Schoenveld, 27, William Carruthers, 29, were arrested on Wednesday when they sailed in from Queensland on board an Australian registered vessel, the Sprightly, an official said.

Six pump-action automatic rifles, six semi-automatic rifles, six pump-action shot guns, one semi-automatic shotgun and 10 semi-automatic pistols

were found on the vessel when it berthed at Loyang on Singapore's northeast coast.

The four pleaded not guilty.

2. Paramedics and nurses staffed hospitals in Bangladesh yesterday after doctors began a three day strike to protest at the government's plan to limit private practice.

Critically ill patients were drenched in driving rains as they left hospitals in search of alternative treatment, witnesses said.

More than 15,000 doctors, representing two-third of the country's practising physicians, went on strike to force the government to scrap proposed medical rules.
