EGYPTIAN HIEROGLYPHS


Egyptian hieroglyphic writing was a monumental style, used in temples, tombs, and the like. It plainly shows its pictographic origin, lacking the pictorial simplifications of cuneiform, of Chinese writing, or even of the everyday hieratic style:

Few Egyptian words were represented by pictures alone. Very early certain hieroglyphs were assigned fixed consonant values, and many of these did double duty as pictographs and as phonetic signs:

Some phonetic signs represented two or more consonants. Since most Egyptian vowel-sounds were not written, a short e is today often inserted to make a more pronounceable transliteration of the consonant clusters. The examples might be pronounced per, mer, neb, rew, and saw:

The Egyptians did not write their language by means of pictographs and phonetic signs alone. These were coupled with signs called determinatives, whose function was to indicate the meaning of the phonetic signs or even to aid in distinguishing words whose meanings were different but whose consonants were identical:


The Egyptian writing system often required considerable duplication of effort to write a simple word. The word yaby, "to be thirsty," contains two phonetic signs, a phonetic complement which emphasizes the pronunciation, and two more determinatives indicating the meaning of the word:



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
