# A Brief Introduction to American Legal Institutions

This text is designed to provide nonnative English speaking lawyers and businessmen with an introduction into the vocabulary and usage associated with the conduct of business and law in an American setting. While a comprehensive examination of the American legal system would be beyond the scope of this book, it **also** briefly introduces the reader to many traditional common law words expressions and American legal documents.

In fine with **the** increasing globalization of the world economy, attaining an adequate grasp of **legal** and business English is necessary for the conduct of business and law in the world today. Even if one never leaves his home country he is still constantly exposed to the **influence** of foreign contacts, primarily of a business nature (i.e. the numerous foreign firms doing business in Thailand, whether they be Japanese, American, European or from other parts of the world). These foreign influences are highlighting (exposing) the need to acquire proficiency in legal and business English. It is the author's own experience, that in the conduct of business and law on four different continents, the: English language was almost *always* the language of international business, regardless of the nationalities of the parties involved.

Furthermore, in light of the continuing importance of the American Economy (currently the largest in the world) it is important that the reader attain a basic understanding of the basic legal processes and precepts upon which the American system is based. This is not however meant to denigrate the contributions of other countries and legal systems, but merely meant to help broaden the readers understanding of the functioning of the American legal system.

Subsequently, the reader will also be introduced to the case law method of **legal** research (i.e. the search for previous legal decisions of controlling or **precedential** value). This text **will** also attempt to define and explain the meaning and importance of the various elements of the common law case.

Therefore, it is with much vigor that I encourage you, the reader, to dedicate yourself to the acquisition of a proficiency over the technical **vocabulary** contained herein. This book will provide numerous exercises and activities to assist **you** in this endeavor, as well as some sample documents to **improve** your knowledge of **legal** and business English.
